The Butterfly Volunteers and their role

The Butterfly Volunteers are specially trained in supporting both the person and those important to them, at the very end of life. At this difficult time, we are able to offer one to one support, compassionate listening, comfort and companionship.

Each visit is unique; sometimes silent company or just a gentle presence is all that is needed. The volunteers can offer respite so that the patient's visitor is able to take a short break away from the bedside, in the knowledge their loved one is not alone.

Part of the volunteer's role can include offering mouth care, reading, playing music, simply chatting or sitting in silence.

The volunteer can advocate for the patient and will be confident to liaise with the ward staff as well as the Specialist Palliative Care Team, if they feel that additional needs are required.

For those visitors who would like to stay with their loved one, we have guest beds and overnight toiletries available to make the stay a little bit more comfortable. Overnight stays are all subject to the Trust policies and agreement with the ward manager.

The butterfly symbol

The purple butterfly symbol is used throughout the hospital to raise awareness that the patient is in the dying stage of life, ensuring dignity and respect at this time.

How to recognise a Butterfly Volunteer

All Butterfly Volunteers wear purple shirts with the butterfly logo on them, and an East and North Hertfordshire NHS Trust identification badge on a purple lanyard.

Where and when are the Butterfly Volunteers available to help?

Butterfly Volunteers are available to visit all adult wards across the Lister Hospital and will liaise with the ward staff before visiting a patient. The service is available 7 days a week, 52 weeks a year, between the hours of 9am to 9pm. The timing of visits are dependent on the daily availability of volunteers.
